Green – Work programme still being adhered to. Our green fertilizer/weedkiller sprayer is no longer reliable and the purchase of a new one has been approved at a cost of £780. The new sprayer will have battery controlled spraying to ensure consistent and even application.

Damage has been done to the green due to bowls being bounced into the surface. Members are reminded that we all have a responsibility to ensure that we and those we play with do not cause damage. Delivery mats are available if anyone has a delivery problem.

Mike Anderson and Colin Potts were thanked for cutting the hedge along Darras Road.

Use of Green - The use of the green by members while 'county or external' matches are taking place was questioned in regards to good manners and avoidance of disruption. The Committee have agreed that in those circumstances where the green has been handed over to the County for their use, regardless of how many rinks are being used, then the green will be closed to general play by members until such time as the green has been handed back. In all other circumstances unused rinks on the green are available to members. However members are reminded that they should avoid causing disturbance or interruption when county or national games are being played.
