Finance – The Treasurer reported that the most significant outgoings since the last meeting were a water bill of £221.89 and £110.16 for the winter shut down of the green irrigation system. The most significant income was £158 from the Daft Dominoes and it was agreed that in future we reduce the ticket prices as the social events were never intended as fund raisers . £120 donation had also been received from the Art Group which uses the premises on a Friday afternoon out of season. The total income from coffee mornings to date is £398.67 which should be on target to cover the season's bus costs.

Green and Site –Winter work is proceeding. We currently have some fusarium in the green but no remedial action can be taken at present. We are still awaiting the cutting down of the laurel bushes at the corners of the green.

Dates for our internal Club events have now also been agreed. The Club will host a Men's, Northern Counties Alsop Cup match between Northumberland and Yorkshire on Saturday 1 June. It is our turn, on Sunday 1 September, to host the Oubridge Cup finals which involve the Club Champions of the private bowling clubs.

Bowls Northumberland News – Proposals to reduce some league formats from the present four triples to three triples were defeated at both the Ladies and Men's AGMs. This is to the benefit of Ponteland as it maximises bowling opportunities for members.
