Re West-Denton Indoor Bowls (WDIBC) - we requested additional rink bookings to accommodate our new members who, wished to bowl indoors, after the outdoor season has finished. (September 18^{th} to about April 13^{th}). But our request was for additional lanes on a Block-Booking basis, has not been successful.

WDIBC have agreed to us having priority for an additional lane on a Tuesday afternoon at 2.30pm only, on a rolling week by week basis, but without guarantee. WDIBC did say that this arrangement should not be a problem though.

On this basis, Allan has decided to prepare a schedule for four rinks on a Tuesday, which will include those that had put their names on the board before July 23rd. Allan still needs an additional 3 men to complete the numbers so we can have a truly mixed session. If you are male & interested let Alan Russell know or speak to me and I will pass your name on to him.

N.B. Block Bookings are where we have lanes reserved every week throughout the indoor season.

Individuals and small groups are still able to book rinks at various times during the week on an ad hoc basis. When WDIBC opens, I will arrange a time where I can meet new members at the facility so I or members from WDIBC can explain how everything works there, so you can continue to enjoy your bowling over the winter. I will email all new members when this will take place (probably late August - early September).

Damage to the Green - we continue to get some damage to our green. Some of this has been caused by visiting teams but some is caused during casual play. If you are having a casual game and the green is being damaged, please take the responsibility to use the green mats, they are in the shed. Our green has been more damp recently as we have been trying to deal with some very dry patches. You can see looking at the green the efforts of the Green Maintenance Team have made a difference to the green.

Pie & Pea Mixed Jumbles – on Sat 13th Aug we are holding a Pie and Pea mixed Jumbles 2.00 for a 2.30 start – so we finish a little nearer tea time when we serve the pie and peas (There will be no Percy and Lorna Telfer Trophy comp on in the morning). Val has put up a list on the notice board for members to sign up. If you would like to socialise and have pie and peas after the game, please sign up on the sheet before the 10th of August, as we need to purchase the pies. The cost will be £6 each which includes entry to the comp. Mixed teams will be drawn on the day of the competition. If you want to take part but do not want to have the pie and peas you will need to come along at 2.00 to sign in and pay your entry fee. Teams will be drawn on the day.
