## Invite past members to the celebration game.

An email has already been sent out to all members asking them to invite past members of the club to come along on the day, if they so wish. We are unable to send out official invites to anyone that is no longer a member as we no longer hold their personal data and if we did have it, we could not use it as this would breach the Data Protection legislation and our own policy - we could face legal action for the misuse of personal data. So, if you are in contact with ex members, please feel free to invite them along to watch the game and enjoy the finger buffet in the clubhouse afterwards. After this there will be drinks in the lounge bar in the Memorial Hall.

- We will need help with setting up the green, collecting and moving crockery, setting up the clubhouse and putting out chairs for spectators etc. Please be willing to lend a hand if asked.
- > There will be no charge for the food on the day.
- > A light buffet will be available to BE players/guests before the match as they arrive from 12.30 in the clubhouse.
- From 1.30 to 1.45 players assemble on the green for a welcome, photo and to raise the flags. The game will start at approximately 2.00 and will last 18 ends.
- > The team has been selected and can be viewed on the clubhouse notice boards.
- We are asking PBC team to come along dressed ready to play (white top with Centenary badge and grey bottoms) and to use the Memorial Hall lounge for any final preparations to play. This will leave the changing rooms in the clubhouse free for the BE team.
- When the game against BE has finished the teams (and BE guests) will move over to the Memorial Hall for afternoon tea/presentations and speeches. There will be a buffet available for spectators, members, and ex members in the clubhouse.
- When BE have vacated the clubhouse and after the finger buffet there will be a Jumbles game for members who could not participate in the BE game, if they would like to play on the day. Teams and organisation will depend on how many members sign up to play This will allow members to watch the celebration game, grab a bite to eat and then participate in a fun competition. A sign-up sheet is up on the notice board in the clubhouse for the Jumbles - please sign up before next weekend.
- The Bar will be available from 4.00pm onwards for everyone times TBC. After the afternoon tea and Jumbles everyone can meet in the lounge of the Memorial Hall for a drink and to socialise.
- > Display of history of the club will be put up in the clubhouse on notice boards.
- Dress code for the BE game all team members to wear centenary badge on their white top with grey trousers.

If we have bad weather and cannot play on our green, the game will be played indoors at WDIBC. Everyone will meet at PBC, drive together to WDIBC, play the game, and then come back for the afternoon tea, buffet etc. In this scenario there would be no Jumbles, so after the tea and buffet it would be socialising in the lounge bar.
