Centenary Match - Wed 12 July

Operational info

- There will be no charge for the food on the day.
- A light buffet will be available to BE players/guests before match as they arrive from 12.30 in the clubhouse.
- From 1.30 to 1.45 players assemble on the green for a welcome, photo and to raise the flags. The game will start at approximately 2.00 and will last 16 ends.
- Men and Ladies Selection Chair's will select the team to play against the BE side 50/50 men/women.
- When the game against BE has finished the teams will move over to the Memorial Hall for afternoon tea/presentations and speeches. There will be a buffet available for spectators/members in the clubhouse (bring own drinks or buy from Memorial Hall).
- After having a bite to eat there will be a Jumbles game for members who could not participate in the BE game, if they would like to play on the day. Teams and organisation will depend on how many members sign up to play This will allow members to watch the celebration game, grab a bite to eat and then participate in a fun competition.
- The Bar will be available from 4.00pm onwards for everyone times TBC. After the afternoon tea and jumbles everyone can meet in the lounge of the Memorial Hall for a drink and to socialise.
- Display of history of the club will be put up in the clubhouse on notice boards.
- Dress code for the BE game all team members to wear centenary badge on their white top with grey trousers.
- We have an alternative plan in place in case of bad weather.

Memorial Hall Parking

The Memorial Hall have informed us the agreement with Parking Eye & Good to Go comes to an end on or around the 10th of June. After this and until they have put a new system of parking charges in place, parking will be free. Before you park in the car park just double check that the number plate recognition cameras have been taken down.

Data Protection

We initially chose not to email members' contact details out. This has proven not to be very efficient or effective for club communication. It is very difficult to update lists as new members join, and wastes paper and ink. Hence, we have decided to email contact lists out to everyone in future. We ask that everyone treat this data respectfully and keep it secure and only for club use.

Digital Technologies

We are going to investigate using the phone app from Bowlr for rink booking next year. This will eliminate a lot of administrative work and members will be able to view rink availability and book rinks without having to come along to the club. The app works on both Apple and Android phones. If we decide to implement this, we will ensure we have some training on the apps use, available to all members.

We have also discussed to possibility of having internet access from the clubhouse and the need to perhaps improve the security of the grounds and clubhouse. No decisions were made on these points as further discussion and investigations are required.

Changes to the original bowling schedule

The following changes have been made to the original schedule: -

- The BBQ will be held on Friday 30th June 1.00 for a 1.30 start. We hope to run a mixed jumbles before the BBQ but we need a couple of volunteers to organise and run it.
- There were two dates for the women's pairs in the original schedule. The women's pairs match will be held on Sat 24th June from 1.00pm. The Women's County C of C 2 and 4 wood finals will be held in the morning before this.

It is likely there will be some more changes to a few Saturdays in June. I will let you know as and when they have been identified/agreed.

Green Bins

We have ordered three green bins (which are brown) from NCC to put our grass cuttings and green waste in. They are the same size as the domestic bins and get emptied every two weeks. Whilst this is going to be a big help to the club, we will still need to have the support of members to help take cutting to the tip when we do a lot of work on the green at the start and end of the season. Also, as it is part of the domestic collection, we will not have any service for Dec, Jan, Feb into mid-March and will need members support to remove the cuttings.

Visitors Charge for playing on our Green

We have updated the charge for visitors playing with a member (we should not have any visitors playing without a member present) on our green. The cost is now $\pounds 5$ for a 2hr session. The charges had not been increased for over 30 years. If you do bring a visitor to the club for a game of bowls, enter their name in the visitor's book and put the money in the box provided.

Lights and locking up.

If we do not need the lights on, please do not put them on and if you do, please turn them off when you leave the changing room/office/kitchen etc. If they are left on when you go out to play bowls, they could be on for a couple of hours for no purpose. We are still getting occasions where members are turning up to the club and lights have been left on.
